Exhibition Description and Criteria:

The exhibition will be a jury-selected grouping of three-dimensional artworks created with the intention of being experienced by blind and physically handicapped patrons and the general public.

- Please limit the use of small removable elements for reasons pertaining to child safety and library management.
- Sculptures will be placed on fabric covered tables.

Eligibility:

This is a "no fee" exhibition and is open to all members of SOS and other interested artists.

Sales: A price list will be provided to CLP, LAMP for the exhibition. All sales of artwork and related taxes will be handled directly through the artist.

Artists Accepted into the Exhibition:

Accepted artists are encouraged to record themselves reading aloud their artwork description and artist's statement. Recordings should not last more than 5 minutes. If you are unable to record, library volunteers will read for you. These recordings along with braille label translations will accompany the artworks on display.
