Exhibition Description and Criteria:

The exhibition will be a jury-selected grouping of 3-dimensional artworks created with the intention of being experienced by blind and physically disabled patrons and the general public.

- Please limit the use of small removable elements for reasons pertaining to child safety and library management.
- Please do not submit artwork with sharp edges.
- Sculptures will be placed on fabric covered tables.

Eligibility:

This is a “no fee” exhibition and is open to all members of SOS and other interested persons.

Sales: A price list will be provided by the Library of Accessible Media for Pennsylvanians during the exhibition. All sales of artwork and related taxes will be handled directly through the artist.

Artists Accepted into the Exhibition - Recording:

Accepted artists are encouraged to record themselves reading aloud their artwork description and artist's statement. Recordings should be 3-4 minutes long. If you are unable to record, library volunteers will read for you. These recordings along with braille label translations will accompany each artwork on display.

To Make Your Recording:
