Inventive use of the space is encouraged, but not required.

Use of media technology is encouraged, but not required.

Sales:

The Society of Sculptors will supply interested patrons with artist contact information. All transactions for artwork will be made by the artist, who will be responsible for delivery, taxes, etc.

Pick-up:

All artwork must be picked-up on the dates specified unless other arrangements have been made. Any artwork remaining at the close of the exhibition will be considered abandoned and to be handled by RMU Media Arts Gallery as they choose.

Insurance and Liability:

RMU Gallery has limited liability coverage that will cover some aspects of the artwork while on display.

Title each document with your name and title of artwork/proposal.





Directions:

Guests must stop at the <u>Barry Center police station</u> to obtain a visitor parking permit. Guests will be required to hang a guest parking permit from their rear view mirror in order to be eligible to park on campus in the reserved, general, faculty/staff or registered free parking areas. To get to the Barry Center, turn right at the second stop sign after entering campus. The Barry Center is the first building on your left.
